The four-day multimedia installation Epicentro consists of prints and video that mediate the trauma of war and the fragility of life. Images of U.S. military weaponry are combined with mythological hybrid creatures from the Wichita Mountains of western Oklahoma to explore notions of assimilation and control. The **symposium** Convergence addresses Hitchcock's themes of exchange and traditional gifting in the context of fertile border zones where translations are never direct, but always fraught with multiple meanings. The history of Venice as a center of trade and cultural exchange mirrors the complexity of encounters in the American West –Hitchcock's home. Leading artists and cultural theorists will explore indigenous perspectives on the meaning of gifting and collaboration through film presentations and discussions.
